

■Euroarea (19) **■Slovakia**



The share of Slovak export to Finland was 0,3 % of the total exports.





 $63{,}7~\%$ of the total Slovak imports come from the EU countries.


The share of Slovak imports from Finland was 0,2 % of the total imports.




Cars production in Slovakia (2001-2014)
